
Mayor Dominy closed the meeting by thanking all in attendance and again acknowledged our many volunteers, as they are the backbone of our community.

Dear Mayor and Members of Council:

This letter will serve to summarize the accomplishments of the Environmental Commission during calendar year 2020:

- At the beginning of the year, before the health emergency, we held two very successful public hikes, with a total of 172 participants.
- We applied for and won a competitive \$5,000 Atlantic City Electric grant to upgrade the trail across Clay Hill. Together with the Green Team, the Lions Club, and the Historical Society, we will rebuild the wooden steps, walkways, and sitting benches. In 2021, this pretty spot along the Mantua Creek will be transformed.
- We installed four outdoor trail map posters to guide visitors in various locations around our trail system.
- We reviewed the Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the proposed passenger rail line, and submitted comments questioning the line's impact on trees especially in Wenonah.
- For the eighth year in a row, we engaged a professional firm to chemically treat local ponds against unsightly duckweed and algae plants during the summer months.
- We continued a wide variety of regular maintenance tasks, including: picking up trash, painting over graffiti, cutting fallen trees, filling in sinkholes, shoring up eroded bridges, protecting trees against beavers, and opening blocked waterways.

- Due to the health emergency we sponsored just one formal work party, but we fielded teams for both Clean Communities Days. We also presented environmental awards to two graduating 6th graders.

In 2021, the Commission will continue to keep the 121-acre “Ring of Green” healthy and accessible for all to enjoy.

Wenonah Shade Tree Commission

2020 Report to Council- Reorganization meeting – January 7, 2021

The Wenonah STC is an organization created by a borough ordinance that tasks us with the regulation, planting, care and control of shade trees within the clear zone – commonly known as the area between the curb and sidewalk or up to 12 feet within the curb should there be no sidewalk. We hold 7 public meetings a year in the Jack Sheppard Sr. Community Center as detailed in the calendar and borough website.

During 2020 we planted 35 new street trees. This year's plantings include 2 new cherry trees added to Wenonah Park in recognition of the graduating classes from Wenonah Elementary and Gateway Regional High School. Their normal graduation celebrations were cut short by covid and we wanted to leave them a lasting memory of their dedication to educational excellence.

The STC responded to over 50 resident and/or Public Works/Borough staff/ Police and Fire Dept. tree related concerns during 2020. We are conducting a borough wide shade tree inventory to help assist with future tree species diversity plantings. We continue to be sensitive to electric and utility wires as we plant new trees seeking to select species that will not interfere with these power sources in the future.

STC members logged over 225 hours in voluntary service to Wenonah during 2020 with time devoted to planting, pruning, tree surveys, supervision of contractors, responding to residents' concerns, training, public meetings and administration.

A continuing project dedicated to public safety and tree health is our Trimming Program. Whenever budget monies allow we contract out companies to trim dead or broken branches. With an estimated total of 2500 street trees this task will be an ongoing process and we will never know its true outcome in that nobody reports when an accident does not occur – whether it is around our school, library, streets or athletic fields. Our trimming efforts fall under safety and prevention and we will continue the program as budgeting allows.

Residents who wish to have major trimming or request removal of a street tree at their own expense must contact the STC for review and approval upon which a no fee permit will be granted. This process protects the interests of the homeowner as we require contractor proof of insurance and agreement on what work is to be done to protect the tree if pruning is all that is required. Full removals are granted upon review of issues like tree health, age, condition and safety.

Wenonah – like many towns in NJ are under watch for the Emerald Ash Borer which have decimated ash trees from Ohio and east. By all predictions it is not a matter of if - but when the ash borer arrives. As such we ask all residents with ash trees on their property to remain alert.

Our thanks go out to Mayor and council for their support and especially the dedicated Boro staff of Karen, Lori and Kathy.

Ken, Brian and Paul along with all Public Works employees deserve great credit in working with the STC throughout the year – along with the Police and Fire Depts.

Our thanks to Greg Hack who moved on into retirement for his many years of service to the STC, Boro and countless volunteer organizations

In 2020 Wenonah was awarded its 24th year of Tree City USA designation by the State of NJ Forestry Service and the Arbor Day Foundation. It is thru the efforts of STC members past and present that Wenonah remains an oasis of greenery. The Wenonah STC is committed to maintaining our trees – a natural resource and point of pride for today and generations to come.

Year End Report for Year 2020

This year was spent on pandemic preparations and information gathering. Daily conference calls with Gloucester County Emergency Management as to the status of the county and state in dealing with the virus. Gloucester County OEM also provided the town with emergency PPE. Most of the PPE went to the Fire Department, including face masks, Tyvek suits, goggles, and gloves. Gloves, face masks, goggles and wipes went to Public Works.

The Mayor signed two (2) emergency declarations, the first on March 17, closing the Municipal Building to the public, and allowing Council meetings to be held via telephone. Although the Municipal building is now open to the public, this declaration remains in effect. The second declaration signed on April 6 put a temporary restriction on online offerings of lodging to reduce the risk of Covid 19 spreading to residents. This declaration is still in effect.

The Emergency Management office has been in daily communications with the Mayor and Fire Chief.

The Borough was approved for a FEMA grant to help pay for the deep cleaning of the Municipal Building. This was a 75/25 grant. I would like to thank Karen Sweeny for taking on the massive amount of paperwork associated with applying for these grants

As of 01/04/2021, the borough has had 74 positive cases of Covid-19 and sadly 2 deaths associated with the virus.

This year saw the review and update of the emergency operating plan for the Borough. This review occurs every four years and once again the plan has been approved by the Gloucester County Office of Emergency Management and the New Jersey State Police.

We continue to monitor the pandemic situation and the vaccine distribution to the public

2020 brought so many changes to the way we all have to go about our daily lives. The staff at Wenonah Public Library rose to the challenge by providing what service we could to the residents of Wenonah during the restrictions in place during the Coronavirus pandemic.

At the start of 2020, the library board of trustees had great expectations for projects planned to respond to requests by residents to improve the atmosphere in the library. You have asked for a comfortable seating area and it is now available, complete with Keurig coffee machine. This did not happen quickly.

On March 16, 2020, the library closed our door to patrons by order of Governor Murphy. The dedicated staff of the library began filling phone message and email requests by our patrons almost immediately. We set up a contactless circulation station outside the library for anyone wishing to borrow. The transit system that provides transportation of items between libraries ceased to operate, so offerings were limited to our own materials. Directors of local libraries set up a monthly swap meet to return items that found their way to any library besides their own. All items were sanitized and quarantined before returning them to shelves or to fill hold requests.

The library board of trustees approved policy changes that ensures safe entry of patrons to the library. We have a sanitizing station in our vestibule, with wipes, masks, and antibacterial gel. We have a plexiglass shield at the main desk. Library staff wipe down all high touch surfaces throughout the day. Books are quarantined for 4 days behind a curtained area restricted from the public.

We began offering Storytime via Facebook Live in April and outdoor story time began on the back patio in August. The library re-opened for regular hours on July 6th.

The Woman's Club of Wenonah included the library in the grand finale event of their Farmer's Market by allowing us to manage the Baby Blue Rolling Kitchen "BBQ in a Bag" sale. We added 3 baskets to the Home & School fundraising project. The proceeds were split between the library and the Home & School Association. Participating in these events proves that the spirit of community volunteerism in Wenonah is still active through these difficult days.

During the week of November 1st the transit delivery system was restarted. Four comfy chairs were delivered November 3rd! And by the end of November, Santa's elves got back to work answering letters from our young residents placed in Santa's mailbox at the checkout desk in the library.

We may not have been able to offer a Children's Summer Reading program, Dog Night at the library, Craft Night, or SAT tutoring lately, but we expect those programs will resume. We are hoping to add more digital services during the coming year to further increase library services to our patrons. In spite of it all, our annual circulation statistics totaled 3666 books and Dvds, plus 1352 digital downloads through Overdrive, bringing the grand total to 5018 items circulated to Wenonah residents and library members from neighboring libraries. Re: Monthly report

Despite the challenges posed to us by COVID, the police department has continued to provide excellent service to our residents. On top of our normal everyday duties, some highlights of the year include:

- Replaced all of our computers to meet new FBI security policy. Officers have been diligently using these computers throughout the past year to support our mission.
- Had some somber moments when our captain's father and father-in-law passed away within the same month at the in Dec. 2019 and Jan. 2020. We were able to provide them a proper send off and assist in the ceremony and processions.
- Passed our third re-accreditation assessment with flying colors. We are one of the longest accredited departments in Gloucester County.
- Back when we were still allowed to interact with people, the PD and our Explorer post both entered Cub Scout Pack 231's Pinewood Derby race (and both lost).
- Participated in several enforcement grants throughout the year including DWI and distracted driving grants.
- Evaluated cost saving measures and planned on implementing several changes in order to accomplish this goal. Although several of them could not take place due to training, we did:
 - develop a partnership with a company to destroy all of our confiscated weapons, and they end up paying us to do it. Normally they would all have just been destroyed at the incinerator with our officers doing all the preparation work.
 - Hosted one class which resulted in free training for members of our department before everything shut down (we had more scheduled), but will continue to do so when things reopen.

- Located two pre-owned vehicles to be used by our detective and administrative bureau. These officers do not need the upgrades of a police interceptor, so purchasing used makes sense.
 - Located a mobile radio for free that can be installed in a vehicle. These radios typically retail for thousands of dollars (more computer than radio these days), so this was a good find.
 - Developed different methods to outfit our patrol vehicles in order to save money. Rather than have Ford do it all we are trying to use our own mechanic and will reevaluate the costs when all work is complete.
-
- Helped to develop a pawn shop ordinance for the borough to discourage these types of businesses from acquiring stolen merchandise should any begin doing business in town.
 - Provided numerous tours to Brownie Troops, Cup Scout Troops, Boy Scout Troops, and school students (at least in the beginning of the year...)
 - Implemented additional protocols and obtained additional supplies to deal with the threat of COVID. Although we had several officers who needed to remain quarantined, we did not have any that actually became infected with the virus.
 - Implemented Pro Phoenix Citizen Services to make it easier for people to report minor incidents online.
 - Performed a considerable amount of drive-bys of residences for things like birthdays, graduations, anniversaries, or any other request where we could make things a little more special during a time when they could not interact with the people who normally would have helped them celebrate these milestones.
 - Lost our captain to retirement, which was great timing on his part! He is still doing well and we are all jealous. We have been steadily adapting to life without him dividing up his responsibilities between several other officers, which is hopefully just a stopgap measure.
 - Made a significant amount of changes to the ways in which we normally handle business. Things like court, car stops, arrests, working with schools, training, and ultimately everything else we

do were affected in some way. We adapted and learned new ways to accomplish these activities while still maintaining our mission.

- Participated in what the organizer wished to classify as a “peaceful march” to show support between our residents and law enforcement. We all met at Chestnut Branch Park where a few small speeches were delivered and then took the walking trail to the police department for a moment of silence.
- Outfitted several patrol vehicles with our new decals which include reference to Wenonah. I really like this design and am happy to be getting rid of our subdued decal design.
- Started replacing patrol rifles and adding additional rifles as tools for our officers. Currently, in order to get rifles on the street quickly, several officers carry their own personal weapons. Although allowed, this is not ideal, so we replaced their rifles with departmentally owned ones and are working on increasing the amount on the road as well. Rifles are unique as they are sighted in for the individual user and cannot really be shared by several officers like a shotgun.
- Reversed our police clerk’s responsibilities in an effort to better cross train in the event of an emergency.
- Processed more firearms applications than in any time in the police department’s history.
- Received and started training with Simunitions in order to obtain the most real-world scenarios possible so that our officers are as prepared to deal with any potential active shooter concerns.
- Received new handguns to replace our quickly aging ones we currently carry that use an outdated accessory rail design.
- Worked through drastic changes to the state’s internal affairs, use of force, marijuana, and juvenile contacts guidelines. We also:
 - Implemented a Handle With Care program to provide necessary notifications to schools when their students are involved in a situation that might reflect in their school activities and work.

- Started organizing an employee assistance program to better provide a level of resiliency necessary for law enforcement officers today.
 - Began a special needs registry and are working on developing a straight to treatment program to get help to those who need it as quickly as possible.
 - A resiliency program to better prepare officers for the ever-changing and stressful events that come along with being a law enforcement officer.
-
- Conducted our first ever mobile inspection checkpoints (two of them) in order to get unsafe vehicles off the road and to help relieve the lines at the inspection stations by performing inspections on the spot.
 - Gave candy out at Halloween allowing us to safely interact with some of our residents.
 - Lost all of our special 1 and special jobs to them accepting other full-time positions.
 - Raised money to be donated to charity through our Movember and Decembeard program (all officers are currently clean shaven).
 - Are working on getting certified to become paperless in order to save money and trees.
 - Finally the PD worked through a global pandemic which none of us have ever experienced. It has taken a lot of critical thinking and evaluation, creativity, luck, and cooperation, but we are muddling through successfully so far.
 - Conducted numerous added patrols for crosswalk violations, radar posts and roving patrols, and set up speed recording/display signs in order to help address some of the traffic complaints around the borough.

Fire Chief's Annual Report to Council

This year the Wenonah Fire Company completed our 132nd year of continual volunteer service to the residents of the Borough of Wenonah. We continue to provide a well-trained, skilled, and dedicated service while saving taxpayers the high cost of a career fire department, we do it for free.

It should come as no surprise that the biggest highlight of the year is the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic that struck our nation and world. Once stay at home orders were put in place, the line officers developed a plan to minimize exposure at fire scenes. President Sole saw to it that the firehouse was prepared and stocked with antiseptic cleaning supplies. The Wenonah and County Offices of Emergency Management provided personal protective equipment such as gloves, masks, face shields, and tyvek suits for use during the pandemic. In order to provide a safer environment, drills were scaled back and gathering as a company limited to emergencies only. As restrictions eased some in the fall, the company had the opportunity to complete mandatory training requirements before a spike in cases again forced the


company to scale back drills. In coordination with the Lions Club, American Legion, and the Borough the annual Independence Day celebration was cancelled this year. The pandemic also prevented the company from doing fire prevention activities at Wenonah School. While those things were disappointing, the community rallied together to make the most of it. A celebratory vehicle parade honoring veterans, first responders, and front-line healthcare workers was conducted in November with the Fire Company participating. I am proud beyond words for the dedication and courage of our membership in maintaining response even in the face of personal risk above and beyond the normal risk of firefighting. Our members continued answering alarms at all times of the day or night. On behalf of the officers, I cannot thank them enough.

Our call volume was down slightly this year, which is likely attributed to the health emergency forcing everyone to stay home and businesses to be closed. This year the company responded to three active dwelling fires within the Borough of Wenonah. In each case, swift and skillful action by our membership and mutual aid partners resulted in minimal damage to the structures and no families displaced. The company also assisted Mantua, West Deptford, Woodbury, Woodbury Heights, and Deptford with working fires over the course of the year.

I am pleased to report as of this date all fire apparatus and equipment is in full working order and up to date with all certifications and testing.

While 2020 presented some of the greatest challenges ever faced by our company, it is our dedicated volunteers who continue to make it happen. The very core of the Wenonah spirit is neighbors helping neighbors. The membership thanks the residents for their support in our fundraisers and the encouraging words received. I would be remiss if I did not encourage all residents to ensure they have an adequate number of working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors in their homes; they save lives. I am proud to be entering my third year as Fire Chief, it is an honor to serve. Stay safe and healthy.
