New Utility Billing Structure For Remainder Of 2023


At the May 25th public meeting, Borough Council adopted Ordinance 2023-7 and Ordinance 2023-8 which changed the billing structure and rates for upcoming water and sewer bills.

Residents have already been billed their flat water payment for 2023 (which was due January 31st) and their actual water usage bill for their prior year's usage (which was due May 16th).

You will receive three (3) more bills for water and sewer in 2023, beginning in July. For these three utility bills, residents will be billed as follows: \$200 flat fee for sewer plus your actual household water usage for the prior three months, billed at the 2023 rates per 1,000 gallons.

This new billing structure will provide a clearer way for residents to understand their water usage and plan for payments, and allow for any issues to be addressed in a timelier manner.

Please see the chart below for the utility billing structure for the remainder of 2023:





Residents can expect to receive their 2nd quarter utility bills via **postcard** in early July.

Information on the utility billing structure for 2024 will be communicated in detail via the Borough's Winter Newsletter published December 1st as well as on the Borough's website.

Primary Election Day Is Tuesday, June 6th

Here are the 3 ways you can vote in the upcoming Primary Election

1. AT YOUR POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY

Vote in person at the Municipal building on Election Day, June 6th from 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM

2. IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING

This option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine during a three-day period prior to Election Day.

You can choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule. Find Gloucester County locations at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

In-Person Early Voting

June 2 - June 4, 2023 Friday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. Sunday, 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

3. VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT

Registered voters can apply for a vote-by-mail ballot by following the instructions found at VOTE.NJ.GOV or contacting the County Clerk's Election Division at 856-384-4500. Voters may also apply in person at the Board of Elections Office, 550 Grove Road, West Deptford until 3:00 PM the day before the election.

The Borough Office will be closed on **Monday**, **June 19th** in observance of Juneteenth and on **Tuesday**, **July 4th** in observance of Independence Day.

Taxes Due August 1st

Third quarter taxes are due on August 1st with a 10-day grace period. Any payment received after the 10th day shall accrue interest back to August 1st.

Payments are accepted by mail or in person during regular business hours. You may also leave your payment in the secured drop box located by the front door of the Municipal building. Please note that we do not accept credit/debit card payments at the Borough Office.

You can also go to our website at www.boroughofwenonah.com to make a payment online (for a fee) or see the amount due.

If you are a new homeowner, please call to receive a copy of your tax bill.

If you receive a tax bill that says "Advice Only" and you pay your own taxes directly, you can use that as your tax bill.



If you receive an original tax bill and your mortgage company pays your taxes, please forward the bill to them.

Signage In The Clear Zone

In order to promote the aesthetic qualities of the Borough and to protect public safety, signage of any type is prohibited in the "clear zone", per Ordinance 56-3.

The "clear zone" is defined as the area lying between the curbline and the paved portion of the sidewalk area.



Where no paved portion exists, the "clear zone" is further

defined as a distance of 12 feet measured from the curbline toward the property line.

Residents, please do your part and move any signage placed by your contractors (lawn service, roofers, painters, realtors, etc.) from the clear zone and onto your property. **Thank you.**

Outdoor Lawn Watering Restrictions

Outdoor lawn watering is restricted because our water supply is not limitless. All municipalities pumping water from the aquifer, as Wenonah does, have limits on the gallons that can be pumped each year so that the aquifer can replenish itself. Restrictions are in place to allow for water for household use and lawn maintenance for all residents, but to avoid going over our allocation.

Per Water Restrictions Resolution #R-2018-57

Watering time limits:

 4:00 am to 9:00 am and 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm



Date limits:

- Odd numbered houses are permitted to water on odd numbered days.
- Even numbered houses are permitted to water on even numbered days.
- Outside watering is not permitted on the 31st of any month.

Exceptions:

- Adult-attended child recreational sprinklers
- Newly installed sod and landscaping

In addition to watering restrictions, the Borough is asking residents to voluntarily conserve water in any way they can as water is a finite resource.



State Low Income Household Assistance Program

The State LIHWAP can help you pay arrears for your water and sewer bills.

The program may also be able to help address tax liens due to water and sewer arrears.

No Idling Zone

New Jersey prohibits idling -defined as when the engine is running but the vehicle is not moving - to no more than 3 minutes under most circumstances.

Idling wastes money and natural resources. It can damage vehicles, pollute the air and harm our health. Air pollution has been linked to asthma and other respiratory problems.

Please be aware of those areas in town where signage is posted. Please turn off your engine - it all adds up to clearer air.




Sewer Backup & Backwater Valve

Per Ordinance 51-3, any property connected to the public sewer system of the Borough of Wenonah shall have a backwater valve installed.

A properly operating backwater valve allows flow to only go out in one direction, preventing wastewater from entering your home during regular sewer maintenance or accidental sewer system backups. To find out if you have or need a backwater valve, check your plumbing plans or consult with a professional plumber.

Keep in mind that if sewage backs up into your home, the cost to repair damages and clean up the mess will be much higher than the costs to install a valve. The Borough cannot be held liable for damages when a backwater valve has not been installed by the property owner.





As a reminder, please do not flush <u>any</u> kind of wipes down the toilet!

Metal and Electronic Pickup



Please contact the Public Works

Department for any metal and electronic pickup.

Items such as TV's, computer monitors, AC units, washers

and dryers, etc. can be picked up on a **daily** basis by Public Works. Please call them during normal business hours at (856) 468-5300.

You don't need to wait for the monthly bulk item collection day to rid your home of these items. Speaking of bulk item collection...



Wenonah Native Garden Club

Interest remains strong in our newly formed club. The name has been shortened, although the Facebook page name remains the same (Wenonah Native Plant Garden Club).

Our mission continues to be encouraging and helping gardeners add native plantings to their yards, reducing the size of lawns, and mitigating invasive plants. To date we have collected more than 25 pledges to replace lawn or similar areas with 25 square feet of native plantings, which include shrubs, forbs, and ground covers.

While the club's main focus is creating better habit in our individual yards in order to create a "Homegrown Park", we have formed one committee so far, chaired by Mary Newcomb,



to work with the Wenonah Lake Association to revitalize the park grounds. We are also looking into forming a separate committee to work with the Environmental Commission to enhance a garden area of Wenonah Woods, at the end of South Clinton Avenue where there is a small pond. Native plantings were installed by the Woman's Club many years ago, and we plan to enhance the area with more plantings, along with removing as many invasive species as possible.

The third committee being explored is for a presence at the Farmer's Market in order to introduce ourselves to the community at large.

At our most recent meeting we welcomed Dr. Randi Eckel, who gave a presentation on "Landscaping with Colorful Native Plants". We meet on the second Thursday of each month at the Jack Sheppard Community Center at 7pm. We welcome both new and experienced gardeners who would like to help improve Wenonah's biome (the community of plants and animals that occur naturally).

As summer approaches, we would ask all homeowners to avoid the practice of creating a "volcano" shaped application of mulch to any tree base. Mulch should always be kept from touching the trunk. Young trees will need a constant supply of water (up to five gallons a week) to survive extreme summer weather.
